Retail scale

- High Street
 - Stores various sizes - across UK
- Edge of centre
 - Large format stores across the UK
 - Retail Park, Stand alone, retail cluster
- Music and Entertainment
 - High street and shopping centres
 - Specific market

Location analysis

- Importance of location
- New developments
- Re-site - Resize
- Refurbishment
- Prioritisation

Why use 2001 census data

- Output Areas for extracting information
 - Geographic data - boundary and point
- Internally tested Output Areas
 - Point and Boundary extents
- Time lag between releases
 - Data costs - manipulation costs

Output Areas and catchments

- Size of Census Output Area allow local statistics to be gathered and compared
- Local area and wider catchments
- Census data linked to site location
 - Car ownership required for access to out of town units

Using key statistics quickly

- Planning benefits from new data
 - Update existing data bases
 - Look at new attributes
 - Process the census data as it gave very specific information
 - Understand how the data would be used and integrated in the future

Integrating other data

- Data within Output Areas
 - Identify High counts in OAs
- Information about stores
 - Add attribute information about consumers
- Research information ‘linked’ to census attributes
 - Provide country wide demand surfaces

A case study

- Students counted at term time
 - Interest after 2001 census - new count
- Population statistics OA level
- Verified with mapping
- Target demographic identified for the event for store promotion

Getting the point across

- Data bases and mapping systems
 - Multiple systems use census data
- Overlays for multiple data sets
 - Vector boundaries and counts
- Develop display for a number of attributes
- Maps recognised and census language understood

Future data

- Output Areas are a stable geography
 - Additional releases of census data
 - Geo-demographic classifications
- Super Output Areas & Data Zones
 - Index of deprivation - England and Scotland
- Develop reporting and display
